Wipes and Tissues

It's been several months since the last time I had you bring wipes and tissues. As always please buy a thicker wipe such as Huggies and a box of soft tissues; the ones with lotion or even Vicks seem to work well. Please have your supplies to daycare by March 13th. If you have a toddler that is potty training or using the toilet it might be better to bring them a package of flushable wipes rather than baby wipes (they are not flushable).



Learning Time - Sign Language

Please put a copy of the sign language words somewhere where you and your little ones will have access to them at all times. The more they hear the word and see the sign that goes along with it the more they are going to remember to use it when communicating, thus eliminating stress and possible arguments over toys when playing with the other kids. They are all very eager to sit down and learn new words each day and I am sure you are starting to notice a difference in their communication skills at home as well.



Please - Make a circle with the right flat hand over the heart.

Thank-you - Touch the lips with the fingertips of one or both flat hands, then move the hands forward until the palms are facing up. It is natural to smile and nod the head while making this sign.



More - Touch the fingertips of both hands before the chest with palms facing down. The right hand can be brought up to meet the left from slightly lower position.



Mother - Touch the right chin with the thumb of the right open hand. The fingers may be wiggled slightly.

Father - Touch the forehead with the thumb of the right open hand. The fingers may be wiggled slightly.



Hurt - Place the right middle finger on the heart with the other fingers extended; then twist the hand quickly forward and outward from the wrist.
